The Cambodia Mission Trip was the journey of God's grace for me. He answered my prayers

The Cambodia Mission Trip was the journey of God's grace for me. He answered my prayers.

Firstly, God's grace among our mission team members. This was my third time to visit Cambodia but I did not know what to expect through the Glow English camp. In the beginning, it was tough to get up at 6 am and teach 3 sessions for a whole day. However, engaging with students and the locals became highlights of each day. I truly enjoyed daily devotionals, eating out together for lunch and dinner in diverse restaurants with the team members. Having wonderful fellowships among the mission team was such a treat and joy! God answered my prayer. Our teamwork in one holy spirit and one mind was the driving force throughout the trip. I thank God for each team player.

Secondly, God's grace for Khmer people. Prior to the trip, my prayer was to have God's vision for Khmer people. God was gracious to grant me His vision for them. While attending the local churches and meeting young Cambodian Christians, I was able to see God's grace overwrapping the bitter, horrendous history of Khmer. On the weekends, we were invited to the local church under the leadership of a Chinese female missionary, and the rural church founded by a HongKong missionary who has been supporting many young Cambodians including the church pastor and his family. I was very impressed and encouraged by these two women of faith and their sacrificial

life for Christ. Young Khmer people are looking for the truth and a secure future. Who can offer the security for eternity except for our Lord, Christ? "The harvest is plentiful but the labourers are few". I pray that God may send more workers to Cambodia and raise Khmer Christians to teach the bible to those who are hungry for the truth.

Thirdly, God's grace for myself. During the trip, I had to deal with stressful issues back in Canada. It was God's grace that held me up amidst trials. Working with wonderful students and encouragements/prayers from the team fellows helped me to focus on Christ rather than problems.



In the end, it was a more personal journey that God showed me where I need to grow mature and surrender myself to His will. "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness. Therefore, I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me." 2 Corinthians 12:9. God answered my last prayer: throughout the trip, He empowered me to serve Cambodians with a humble heart by God's grace.

If anyone is interested in any type of mission trip, I strongly recommend the Cambodian trip. 🌀

The Ministry Partner: Glow Cambodia

Glow Cambodia (Glow) is a local, non-profit, Christian-based school, established a few years ago by Dr. Andrew and Josephine Kwong, missionaries who have lived in Cambodia for 40 years. The school serves the lower middle-class population in Phnom Penh, who are typically overlooked by the foreign NGOs who focus services for the poorest of poor and by the international schools who focus their education for the wealthiest in Cambodia.

Glow's vision is to impact the field of education in Cambodia by creating a model school with quality teaching and curriculum for all learners. Glow currently has a primary school and aims to gradually introduce the high school, grade by grade, within the next few years. They are also starting a special education department to help children who struggle with learning and a training program for local teachers.

Confirmation from God: What Attracted Me to Cambodia

Known as the "Land of Smiles," Cambodia had a "laid-back" charm that was hard for me to forget. The country seemed so undeveloped and its natural beauty captivated me, both in the capital and on the beaches. The people, seemingly materially poor, were so generous with their time and small gifts. I felt a pull towards the poor and the marginalized people, and I wanted to help Cambodians develop a voice for themselves. During each of my trips, God has placed specific people on my heart to remind me of His love for the Cambodians. During my first trip to Cambodia, God placed on my heart the face of one little boy, a mute who could dance like an angel. During my most recent trip, the father of a deaf boy, who I had been working with during the Go and Love English summer camp, told me that it was God's plan for me to be at Glow Cambodia, so I could help his son.

The Motivation Behind My Life: On-Board with God's Mission

After my first trip to Cambodia in 2010, I felt a desire to return to Cambodia but did not know how I could help. So, I decided to return to Cambodia as often as I could in the following years to explore the different options available for speech-language pathologists to work in the country (which is what I am trained to do). During my third trip, I came to know about Glow Cambodia and helped with a workshop on speech and language delays. I returned to Glow almost every year after that to see how my background and experiences could fit with Glow's plans to expand. During these trips, I was invited to train teachers and assess the speech and language skills of Glow's kindergarten students who struggled with reading and speaking.

Many people have commented that I am blessed to know what God's purpose for my life is. The underlying question should rather be, "Is what I'm doing with my life on board with God's mission on earth?" Over the past 10 years, I've come to realize that God has already told us what He wants us to do with our lives: He wants us to love and obey Him with all that we are and to take care of His creation. During my time in Cambodia, I realized that God was at work in this country, both spiritually and economically. Although Cambodia has changed much in the past few years, and the Western and Chinese worlds are increasingly influencing Cambodia's economy and culture, God has helped me to realize that the Cambodians are the same as they were 10 years ago, still in need of a God who cares about them personally and who loves them. God has also been helping me to see these truths in my own life, reminding me that I am His beloved child and am worthy to be used by Him for His mission of love for the world.

A Reflection for my trip to Glow Cambodia School

In Aug 2019, I joined a team of 10 people to visit Glow International School to work as an English teacher for the local children in Phnom Penh. It is my first time visit to Cambodia and it is an eye-opening experience for me. This is my fourth time doing a short term missionary trip but this

trip is certainly one of the most unforgettable trips in my life.

First, I must give thanks to our Lord for giving me the opportunity to serve with such amazing teammates and leaders. I learn so much from each of them. I am impressed by their passion for God's work, their intelligence in lesson design and delivery, perseverance at difficult times and the strong trust and devotion to our Lord in all circumstances.

I am very fortunate to be part of the team so I can learn 3 Bible verses by heart, through personal experience.

The first verse: "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose." (Roman 8:28)

The second verse: But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness. Therefore, I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me. That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strong." (2 Corinthians 12:9-

During this summer camp, we faced many challenges such as language barrier (unable to use translators); difficulty in finding suitable classrooms (we need to run up and down the high stairs to search for the switch to control the air conditioner, projector, paper or markers, etc.); conflict about teaching styles; the tight schedule of the Glow camp timetable and the health problems of myself and many other teammates.

Physically I was very tired due to the very tight schedule of the summer camp as we had to run 3 camps each day. serving 3 different groups of children every day. Mentally I felt helpless as more and more of our teammates including myself falling sick with diarrhea while we needed to travel to the village church. We were all worried about the need to use washrooms during the 2-hour ride from Phnom Penh to the Village. We could do nothing but prayed. My

cell group members at RHCCC, happened to be together at a cruise in Europe, all gathered together to pray earnestly for our Cambodian team. God listened to all our prayers and granted us a very smooth trip to the Village church. It was a very rewarding and fulfilling 2-day activities for the village children. The thin cows we saw on the road; the beautiful and innocent village children; the very delicious food prepared by the pastor's wife and above all, the warmth and care of the village church leaders made these 2 days the highlight of this short-term missionary trip.

Although we experienced various difficulties, God put everything in place finally. He showed us that He is in control in the stormy seas. We are weak but our Lord will strengthen us to achieve His goals.

Thus, in Sept /2019, when my cell group in RHCCC was studying 1 Thessalonians 5, "Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.", I have a better understanding of what the verse means. In hardship, we must trust our Lord and face the challenges with endurance, patience and hope. It seems abstract, but our Lord just demonstrated the concept to me through this Cambodian trip. I told myself that I must remember this experience and have a thankful heart in all circumstances while doing work for God.

Last but not least, I must thank all my teammates again for providing me such precious opportunity to learn from their life experience and modeling. The amazing PowerPoints used in the presentation about "Creation"; the beautiful songs used in singspiration and their gestures; the clear and lively teaching styles of various teachers, the care and detailed organization provided by our team leaders, are all great examples and models, which I should learn so as to further equip myself for the work of our Lord in future.
